- Students must also meet any college placement scores required for course enrollment.

College Transfer Pathways

- Juniors and Seniors
- 3.0 weighted G.P.A.
- Students must also pass all Writing, Reading and Math sections of a college placement test to be accepted into the CCP College Transfer program.
