- The high school principal's approval to enroll.
- Registration in some Career Technical Pathways may require Placement Testing.

College Transfer Pathways

- Juniors and Seniors
- 3.0 weighted G.P.A.
- Students must also pass all Writing, Reading and Math sections of a college placement test to be accepted into the CCP College Transfer program.
