Application Process**

Dual-Enrolled Admission - Overview

High school juniors or seniors who wish to pursue an academic program at the collegiate level while attending high school.

Students choose to enroll because:

- exceeded course offerings at high school
- interested in earning college credit

Admission Requirements

- be in good academic standing with their high school
- be in their junior or senior year, though some exceptions may apply
- have a 3.5 cumulative, weighted grade point average
- have one of the following:
 - SAT score of 1170 or higher (Math & Evidence-Based Reading and Writing only)
 - ACT or Pre-ACT Composite of 24 or higher
 - PSAT “Test Scores” of 56 or higher (Math & Reading Only)
 - PSAT “Total Scores” of 1048 or higher (Math & Evidence-Based Reading and Writing Only)

Application Deadlines

Application deadlines are firm and therefore, late applications will NOT be considered.

Responsibility of UNCW Dual Enrolled Student

- Submit all AP scores for placement purposes.
- Complete course registration.
- Register for no more than two courses.
- Adhere to all UNCW deadlines:
 - Secure transportation to and from UNCW.

 - Pay all UNCW tuition bills by deadlines.

 - Non-degree seeking students are not eligible for financial aid.

Registering for UNCW Courses

- Dual Enrolled students do not attend orientation
- Students register themselves for courses
 - no more than two courses
- Course availability is first come first serve
- If a class is full/closed you can continue to watch for a spot to open in that class or add your name to the waitlist (if available).
 - Ms. Leinwand nor Ms. Thornhill will contact the department to get you into a class.

Important Notes from Hoggard

- Students must research pre-reqs and choose the classes they want to take
- Students receive high school credit AND college credit
- UNCW Grades will be on your college transcript for any college you go to as you must report them.
- Doing poorly in UNCW classes such as receiving “D’s” or “F’s” could impact your financial aid after high school graduation.
- All UNCW classes for class of 2019 and beyond have AP/IB weight which is a 5.0


- **April 1st: ALL application materials must be submitted to UNCW**

Next Steps

1. Complete UNCW Dual Enrollment application for the term you want to take classes.
2. After you complete the application, print off a Counselor Form for Ms. Leinwand to fill out and then you will upload this. Have classes already in mind that you do or should qualify for.
3. Submit your application!
4. Submit your official test scores (SAT, ACT, Pre-ACT or PSAT) to UNCW.
5. Submit your AP test scores for required classes.
6. Placement exams may be required for Math and are required for Foreign Language.
7. Hoggard will submit your transcripts (after you have met with Ms. Leinwand to go over your counselor form.)
8. Once your application is complete, Susan Thornhill will be your point of contact at UNCW, her information is attached to the material I am giving you.
9. Your family will be billed through your UNCW account, make sure you pay on time.
10. Hoggard will make schedule changes to your high school schedule once you are registered for a UNCW class. Schedule changes for Dual Enrollment will take place in early August. We will do our best to accommodate your schedule, but ultimately you must be flexible as well. We cannot overload a Hoggard class to accommodate your UNCW class.

Final Notes

- If you are planning to apply to UNCW as a dual enrolled student, please complete the application and bring the counselor form completed to Mrs. Leinwand in student services. You must initiate this process yourself.
- **All materials* are due to UNCW by April 1st, including the counselor form. If you miss the deadline there is no extension.**
